Local Nature Reserve Update

Since the last newsletter a number of projects have taken place at The Withey Beds LNR. One exciting development has been the construction of a living willow nature hide. More than 60 children and adults visited The Withey Beds over February half term, as part of the Council led Nature Week 2006. Everyone helped with tasks ranging from laying the ground sheet and making windows to actually forming the dome and tying the willow in place. The willow has already started to grow so you will soon be able to spot a few animals whilst hiding in the hide!

You may have also noticed a new installation to one of the trees at The Withey Beds. A barn owl box has kindly been donated and installed by Three Valleys Water. Barn owls were once a common sight in the county but have declined by 90% since the 1930s. The box at The Withey Beds has a number, 1645, so if you see a barn owl nesting here then please let us know.

The other big change at The Withey Beds is the installation of two bridges. You will finally be able to complete a circular walk around the LNR, rather than having to turn back on yourself. The bridges cross the central ditch.

Bird News by Anna Marett

The resident birds are now breeding on the reserve alongside returning migrants such as chiffchaff, blackcap and whitethroat. arrive in May from Africa but swallows and house martins have already made the return journey to this country.

The dawn chorus is a rich reward for anyone making an early morning visit especially in May. You may hear the first wren, blackbird or robin from about 4am!

Look out for a fast flying kingfisher along the river and also for pied and grey wagtails searching for food at the pond edge.

Green and Great Spotted Woodpeckers are regularly seen on the reserve - early spring is the best time to hear their 'drumming' on the trees. Lesser Spotted Woodpeckers are also occasional visitors here.

A list of birds seen on or flying over the reserve is now displayed in the noticeboard at the beginning of the LNR.
